- 1) Welcome and catching up. Meeting was called to order at 6:38pm.

3) Administrative business:

- O JL updated us on the progress of the office building: the front door is on; the brickwork is nearly done next up are roofers, and John is seeking a sheetrocker
- The FY23 funds have been dispersed; we will start operating with those next month.

4) River Community and Town Infrastructure Grants

- O 2022 grants: FNESU LEAPS program project with the Youth Council got derailed this year, but they are still interested in completing the project are we willing/able to offer them a full-year extension? DS motions to extend these until January; JL seconds; motion approved.
- We received the final report for this year's Teen Week on the River camp they had some hiccups with presenters and with not enough video footage for the PSAs, but have lessons-learned, and still had a successful week.

9) Other/Public Comment

Sampsonville remains removal: matching our federal funds to other sources is somewhat problematic – may have to search around a bit.

Partnership Rivers meeting in Florida (Wekiva River) this December (7-9). Who wants to represent UMATR?

JL talked with Vtrans folks – there's a ditch along 105 that gets filled with toilet paper. Septic issue? Would be good to have a conversation with the folks; or to submit an ANR report so that it gets investigated, if the conversation route doesn't go anywhere. (there is available funding to help with septic issues).

Social Marketing Workshop that Susan and Sarah attended: impacting social norms to encourage certain behaviors – i.e. "clean, drain, dry": use visual cues (signage), personal interactions (steward), and social pressure – signs alone don't work! Susan is now being asked to join a workgroup for projects – do we have any to suggest?

- Swimming Holes: Don't litter
- Raise can deposit amount get people to stop throwing them out
- Recruitment: why is it important for our towns to have a rep on our committee? Name recognition; could town reps go to other towns and show how we have benefited?
- Would be good to have more "human interest" stories in newspapers.

Legislation introduced to approve studies for the Nulhegan River, the Deerfield River, and for designation of the York and Husatonic Rivers.

Big Falls: has gotten more popular; could we connect with the state to do more here? Lindsey needs to follow up with VRC about the below-the-falls Management Plan and improvements project.

Need to pursue Stewardship Position.

Jay Peak was purchased, so snowmaking expansion will be a priority. Lindsey and Jim will meet with Walter, Director of Operations, in October to discuss.
