2023 UMATR Newsletter – 2023 Grant Highlights











Our 2023 River Community Grants funded **eight** projects within our UMATR region, resulting in **\$32,750** being spent on projects that protect and enhance the enjoyment and quality of the upper Missisquoi and Trout Rivers. Enosburgh Rec increased river



access to the Missisquoi by adding paddleboards to their fleet of kayaks and canoes on the Brownway Trail. The Franklin County Natural Resources Conservation District hosted four BioBlitz events for the public and local youth in Montgomery and Richford, as well as the first annual Enosburg Fishing Festival. The Richford Conservation Commission constructed bat boxes, started a no-mow-May campaign, and educated local residents about both bats and pollinators, and the important roles they play in our ecosystems. NCSU's Encore Program provided a group of



Our 2023 Municipal Grants funded **five** projects within **five** municipalities in our UMATR region, totaling to **\$50,000** spent on roadway and infrastructure improvements that benefit local teens an awesome paddling experience. Montgomery Conservation Commission began treatment on a J. knotweed patch on town land. All of these projects, and more, are what makes our community so great.

2023 UMATR Newsletter - 2023 July Flooding & Food Resilience



In July 2023, the entire state of Vermont experienced a seemingly endless stretch of rain resulting in intense flooding. On July 9th, the day before the major day of flooding, we hosted our Swiftwater Paddle Instruction below the Enosburg Dam, and the following day the water was so high there were no visible rocks below the raging flood waters (see pictures to the left for comparison). The beach that attendees entered the water in was no longer accessible. Other access points were affected too: like the wooden steps we installed in Westfield in 2018. Luckily, our steps are anchored, though they did end up pointing uphill in the 2nd

picture! As these high storm water events become more frequent, we are proud to offer Municipal Grant funding for our UMATR towns and municipalities to tackle projects that address stormwater. We know that towns have innumerable demands on limited resources to maintain infrastructure, and the 2023 flooding has again shown how important such projects are to protecting our rivers and our towns. Improved culvert and stone-lined ditches may not seem exciting – but they are effective, especially during these unexpected high water events. Each Municipal Grant project that is funded by UMATR aims to address the protection and enhancement of the water that flows through our UMATR region, with a specific emphasis on water quality.
